Director's Note

My daughter, who counts writing as one of her many talents, started college last year. Like her brother before her, she left the nest and began her journey through life in a vastly different world than the one my sister, brothers and I grew up in – one that seems to constrict and threaten her future freedom and happiness on a daily basis. So when I read this play, and saw how Ms. Adams described her now-13-year-old present day as "our time of mingled hope and fear," it struck a chord. This thing has been happening for a while now.

There's plenty of well-documented history about the English civil wars, the great fire, the brief period when English royalty were executed, and the Commonwealth ascended. Aphra Behn and Nell Gwynne's pasts are more amorphous, which allowed Ms. Adams to use them freely to illustrate the era of the "merry monarch" Charles II, and the new age of creativity and social freedom that flourished in the Restoration. It gives me hope that this kind of thing is cyclical – that enlightened thinking and love eventually win out. Like Aphra and her strong-willed, good friends – both real-life and imaginary(?) in this play - we just have to choose it.

We started STC to tell stories with new voices and bring present-day issues to life, while still being entertaining enough to bring new people into the theater (and not just us stuffy literary types). OR, does that in spades. There's history, eloquence, danger and some puerile door-slamming fun, and we are so grateful to Burning Coal Theater for making it possible to add this "bonus show" to our regular season.
